

ORGANIZATION THAT RESCUES SLAVES CELEBRATES FIRST YEAR AT  
SOULFEST

*International Justice Mission staff at Soulfest available to discuss victim rescues, recent book release and this week's Soul University seminars*

August 3, 2005 – Gilford, NH - International Justice Mission, an organization that rescues victims of violence, slavery, sexual exploitation and oppression will be a part of Soulfest for the first time this year. Representatives will lead Soul U seminars at 4:15 pm Thursday, Friday and Saturday of the festival, teaching how women, students and other groups can become involved with the work of justice. On Saturday evening, IJM Founder and President Gary Haugen will be speaking from the main stage following Chris Tomlin's performance. Haugen and IJM have recently released the book *Terrify No More*, the dramatic story of rescuing 37 girls in Cambodia from forced prostitution. Gregg Hunter, *Terrify No More's* co-author, will be leading a Soul University seminar on the book. He and others will be available for interviews.
