INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE MISSION STORY WINS PRIMETIME EMMYS

*IJM brothel rescues in Cambodia featured on Dateline NBC's "Children for Sale"
is awarded two Emmys*

WASHINGTON DC, September 22, 2005 – “Children for Sale,” a Dateline NBC story about IJM’s undercover operation in Svay Pak, Cambodia was awarded two Emmys Sunday night. The segment won the award for both “Outstanding Investigative Journalism in a News Magazine” and “Best Report in a News Magazine.” In that investigation, IJM worked with local authorities to facilitate raids of several brothels that resulted in the rescue of 37 girls, the youngest of whom was five years old. IJM lawyers then work to achieve the prosecution of more than a dozen traffickers and brothel keepers. The broadcast aired in the United States and Canada in January 2004. This investigative report brought international attention to trafficking in children and was instrumental in the recent conviction of a Canadian sex tourist.

The Svay Pak story is also featured in the new book “Terrify No More” written by IJM Founder and President, Gary Haugen.
